Notice to Voters: If you are voting on Election Day, your ballot must be initialed by two election inspectors. If you are voting absentee, your ballot must be initialed by the municipal clerk or deputy clerk. Your ballot may not be counted without initials. (See back of ballot for initials.)

Instructions to Voters

If you make a mistake on your ballot or have a question, ask an election inspector for help. (Absentee Voters: Contact your municipal clerk.)

To vote in favor of a question, make an "X" or other mark in the square at the RIGHT of "Yes."

To vote against a question, make an "X" or other mark in the square at the RIGHT of "No."

REFERENDUM TO AUTHORIZE BORROWING

Shall the Montello School District of Marquette County and Green Lake County, Wisconsin, be authorized to issue, pursuant to Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes, general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$4,500,000 for the public purpose of paying for the cost of replacing portions of the roof, replacing roof-mounted air conditioning units, improving electrical controls, replacing carpet and removing asbestos, bringing the fire alarm system up to code, and such other improvements as may be necessary; and for paying the costs of any professional fees and expenses associated with the foregoing, including the costs and fees of issuing Bonds.

NOTICE OF REFERENDUM

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at an election to be held in the County of Marquette, on Tuesday, November 6, 2018, the following question will be submitted to a vote of the people:

QUESTION 1: Shall the County of Marquette, Wisconsin, adopt the following resolution? RESOLVED, THAT "WE THE PEOPLE" OF MARQUETTE COUNTY, WISCONSIN, SUPPORT THE RIGHT OF ITS CITIZENS TO ACQUIRE, POSSESS AND USE MEDICAL CANNABIS UPON THE RECOMMENDATION OF A LICENSED PHYSICIAN, AND; BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT WE STRONGLY SUPPORT A STATEWIDE REFERENDUM **REQUESTING WISCONSIN TO JOIN WITH THIRTY-TWO (32)** OTHER STATES THAT HAVE ALREADY APPROVED THE USE OF MEDICAL CANNABIS FOR THE TREATMENT OF CHRONIC PAIN, SEVERAL DEBILITATING DISEASES AND DISABLING SYMPTOMS. A copy of the entire text of the resolution directing the submission of the question can be obtained from the office of the county clerk. Acceptable Photo ID will be required to vote at this election. If you do not have a photo ID you may obtain a free ID for voting from the Division of Motor Vehicles.

VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT

Any qualified elector who is unable or unwilling to appear at the polling place on Election Day may request to vote an absentee ballot. A qualified elector is any U.S. citizen, who will be 18 years of age or older on Election Day, who has resided in the ward or municipality where he or she wishes to vote for at least 10 consecutive days before the election. The elector must also be registered in order to receive an absentee ballot. Proof of identification must be provided before an absentee ballot may be issued.

You must make a request for an absentee ballot in writing.

Contact your municipal clerk and request that an application for an absentee ballot be sent to you for the primary or election or both. You may also submit a written request in the form of a letter. Your written request must list your voting address within the municipality where you wish to vote, the address where the absentee ballot should be sent, if different, and your signature. You may make application for an absentee ballot by mail or in person.

Making application to receive an absentee ballot by mail.

The deadline for making application to receive an absentee by mail is: 5:00 p.m. on the fifth day before the election, Thursday, November 1, 2018.

Note: Special absentee voting application provisions apply to electors who are indefinitely confined to home or a care facility, in the military, hospitalized, or serving as a sequestered juror. If this applies to you, contact the municipal clerk regarding deadlines for requesting and submitting an absentee ballot.

Voting an absentee ballot in person.

You may also request and vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office or other specified location during the days and hours specified for casting an absentee ballot in person. For dates and times for in person voting for the November 6, 2018 Election contact the respective Town, Village or City Clerk. View their public posting for specific hours of availability, instructions for making an appointment and location of in person voting.

Municipal Clerks have been advised to post this notice within their respective Towns, Villages or City. Voters must take note of the hours and dates of availability of the municipal clerks for in-person voting as all Clerks in the Towns and some of the Villages within Marquette County are part-time.

The first day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office varies by municipality – see the notations on postings for each Town, Village or City. Ballots are now available from the municipal clerks.

The last day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office is no later than the Sunday before the election — see the notations for each Town, Village or City as the last day is determined by the municipal clerks.

No in-person absentee voting may occur on the day before the election.

The municipal clerk will deliver voted ballots returned on or before Election Day to the proper polling place or counting location before the polls close on Tuesday, November 6, 2018. Any ballots received after the polls close will not be counted.
