RESOLUTION NUMBER 1-2000

Relating to our objection to any large scale extraction of ground or surface water.

The Town Board of Supervisors of the Town of Mekan, Marquette County, Wisconsin, duly assembled at its regular meeting begun on the 8th day of February, 2000, does resolve as follows:

WHEREAS, for the safety and well being of all persons residing in the Town and
WHEREAS, it is deemed necessary, for safety and health to protect the quality and availability of the natural supply of artisan well water which many persons in the Town of Mekan rely upon as their source of water, and
WHEREAS, we have already experienced a decrease in the numbers of artisan wells and a decrease in the volume of water from those wells which are still in use

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town of Mekan goes on record as opposing any large scale extraction of ground or surface water within the Town or any neighboring municipality in which the same aquifer is available, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town of Mekan believes that the State of Wisconsin should establish regulations that require a full Environmental Impact Statement and Hydrogeological Study as a basis in determining if large scale extraction of water is to be allowed and that such wells will not have a negative impact

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution will be sent to the Governor, State Senator, State Representative DNR Secretary, Perrier Group of America and any other interested party.
